EVENT OVERVIEW

The UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are the pinnacle event for amateur road cyclists of all ages across all continents. To qualify for the annual Gran Fondo World Championships riders must finish in the top 25% at a UCI Gran Fondo World Series event.

HOW TO QUALIFY FOR THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each UCI Gran Fondo World Series event grants qualification rights for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. Based on the results of each race, the top 25% in each age group qualify for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. The 25% is calculated based on the number of starters in each age group, and not on the number of riders having finished the race. Riders must finish the race to gain qualification.

Note: the first three riders of each official age category qualify directly for the World Championships, independently of the number of starters in that age group.

Qualification is not overseen by the organisers of the World Championships, nor the organisers of the World Series qualifying races. All qualifications are verified by the UCI before being issued an invitation to enter. Therefore, all qualification enquiries from a World Series race must be directed to info@ucigranfondonworldseries.com

ADDITIONAL WAYS TO QUALIFY

Outgoing UCI Gran Fondo World Champions

The outgoing UCI Gran Fondo World Champions in the time trial and road race may take part in the first UCI Gran Fondo World Championships following their title, in both the time trial and road race.

Invitations to enter will be sent to the 2024 World Champions from the UCI.

Masters National Champions

All Masters national champions from the current year (in road race and individual time trial only) may enter the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships without qualification via the UCI Gran Fondo World Series. The Masters national champions in road race and time trial are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.

Invitations to enter will be sent to Masters National Champions from the UCI.

Wildcards

The following wildcards allow riders to participate directly in the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships:

- Each UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier event may grant 5 wildcards to riders who participated in their respective qualification event. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by each UCI Gran Fondo World Series organiser.
- All countries not hosting a UCI Gran Fondo World Series qualifier event may grant 10 wildcards (5 men / 5 women) to riders of their choice. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.

Wildcard invitations to enter will be sent from the UCI.

National Federation Wildcards

The National Federation of the country of the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships may award an additional 20 wildcards (to 10 women and 10 men), which allow athletes to participate in both the time trial and road race. These wildcards are confirmed to the UCI by the respective National Federation.

Invitations to enter will be sent by from the UCI.

GETTING TO THE EVENT

WHERE IS LORNE?

Lorne is located on the Great Ocean Road in Victoria, Australia. The capital city of Victoria is Melbourne.



AIRPORTS

The closest international airport is Melbourne Airport (MEL). Drive time from Melbourne Airport to Geelong is approximately 1hr15mins (85kms). Drive time from Melbourne Airport to Lorne is approximately 2hrs (150kms). Note: be sure you don't book a flight to Melbourne Orlando Airport!

The closest domestic airport is Avalon Airport. Jetstar services Avalon Airport with services between Sydney (SYD), Brisbane (BNE) and Gold Coast (OOL). Drive time to Geelong from Avalon Airport is approximately 25mins (25kms). Drive time to Lorne from Avalon Airport is approximately 1hr15mins (90kms).

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

Gull Airport Service offers up to 170 scheduled shuttle services between Melbourne Airport and Geelong every week. Once you arrive in Geelong you can catch a bus with McHarry's to take you through to Lorne.

CAR PARKING

No official car parking is provided in Lorne or Geelong for the event. In some areas there is paid parking, while in other areas there is free parking. Drivers must obey all parking signs. Note: a solid yellow line means no parking.

Riders and supporters are responsible for obtaining the necessary travel documentation to enter Australia and participate in the 2025 UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. Information on visas to Australia can be found at the **Department of Home Affairs**.

Should you require a letter of invitation to support your VISA application, please contact the Local Organizing Committee via email (2025granfondo@auscycling.org.au) and provide the following information:

- First Name and Family Name (surname)
- Nationality
- Date and place of birth
- Passport number
- UCI ID number (if racing)
- Function (i.e. athlete, coach, accompanying person, etc.)
- Arrival and departure date
- Copy of your email from the UCI inviting you to enter.


Once received the Australian Cycling Federation (AusCycling) will confirm your qualification with the UCI and prepare an official invitation letter to support your application.

ROAD CLOSURES

As a participant, spectator or local resident, it's important to understand the Road Closures associated with each competition day.

Traffic controllers will not be letting any cars through so please be organised! 😊

Note: Saying "I'm racing the world championships" will not make any difference!

INTERACTIVE MAPS

The following Interactive Road Closure Maps have been prepared for each competition day to help you understand the closures associated with individual sections of road. Simply click on a stretch of road to view the event day closure types, timings and detours.

- **Thursday 16 October (Time Trial)**

IMPORTANT: Access on Thursday into Lorne on the B100 (& C151) from the east (Anglesea / Fairhaven / Geelong, Deans Marsh etc) shuts at **09:00** so even if your individual start time is mid-morning or in the afternoon, you need to arrive in Lorne **BEFORE 09:00**. Access on the B100 from the west (Apollo Bay, Wye Rive etc) is not affected on Time Trial race day.

- **Friday 17 October (Team Relay)**

- **Sunday 19 October (Road Race)**

IMPORTANT: Access on Sunday into Lorne on the B100 from the east (Anglesea / Fairhaven / Geelong etc) shuts at **06:30** so regardless of your start wave, you must arrive in Lorne **BEFORE 06:30**. Furthermore, the C151 between Deans Marsh and Lorne gets shut at **06:00** at Deans Marsh.

Road closures are in place to protect everyone associated with the event. This includes competitors, event staff, volunteers, contractors and supporters. Failing to observe a road closure will lead to automatic rider disqualification and drivers may face penalties and prosecution by Police.

RACE DETAILS

INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL (THURSDAY)

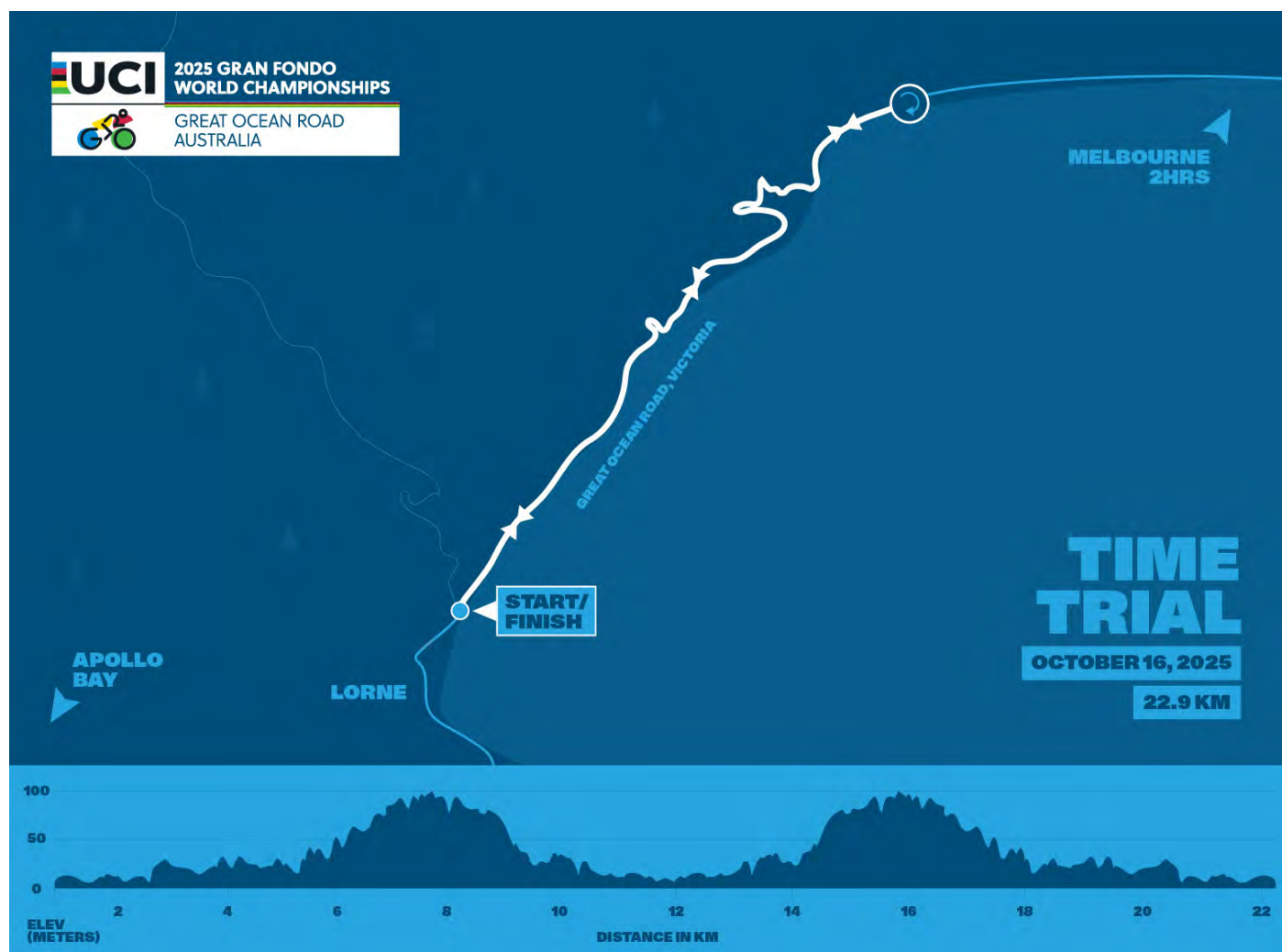
The Time Trial will start and finish in Lorne and features some of the most spectacular sections of Victoria's iconic Great Ocean Road.

The out-and-back course turns at the iconic Memorial Arch at Eastern View (near Fairhaven) and features a mix of challenging climbs, rolling hills and scenic coastal views making it a challenging yet rewarding course.

Bike Check	<p>The mandatory bike check will occur prior to every rider starting the time trial. This will be done in the Bike Check tent adjacent to the Time Trial start ramp.</p> <p>A non-compulsory bike check service will also be offered on Wednesday enabling riders to ask questions or seek assistance to ensure their bike meets the UCI regulations, prior to race day.</p> <p>Refer page 22 for the Time Trial bike regulations.</p>
Warm Up Area	<p>A Warm-Up tent will be set up adjacent to the Time Trial start ramp. One section will be equipped with stationary bikes, and another section will have floor space for riders to set up their own rollers.</p> <p>A maximum of 20mins per rider in either section.</p>
Start Order	<p>Final start list will be published on Tuesday 14 October noting that the overarching start order is according to age groups; Women first (from older age groups to younger), followed by Men (from older age groups to younger). Youngest men will be the last to depart.</p> <p>Riders will depart at 30 second intervals.</p>
Specific Rules	Drafting is forbidden; any riders not obeying this rule will be disqualified. When overtaking a rider, you must ensure a distance of 2m separates both riders, and the overtaken rider must then leave a gap of 25m behind the passing rider.
Follow Vehicles	Follow vehicles are not permitted.
Road Closures	Full Road Closures.

TEAM RELAY (FRIDAY)

Team Relay is an official World Championship event with rainbow jerseys and medals awarded. It is open to all athletes who are registered for the Time Trial and/or Gran Fondo.

This year's Team Relay will take place in the port city of Geelong overlooking Corio Bay. Geelong is the largest regional city in Victoria and one that is synonymous with hosting world-class cycling events such as the 2010 Road Cycling World Championships, and the annual Cadel Evans Great Ocean Road Race.

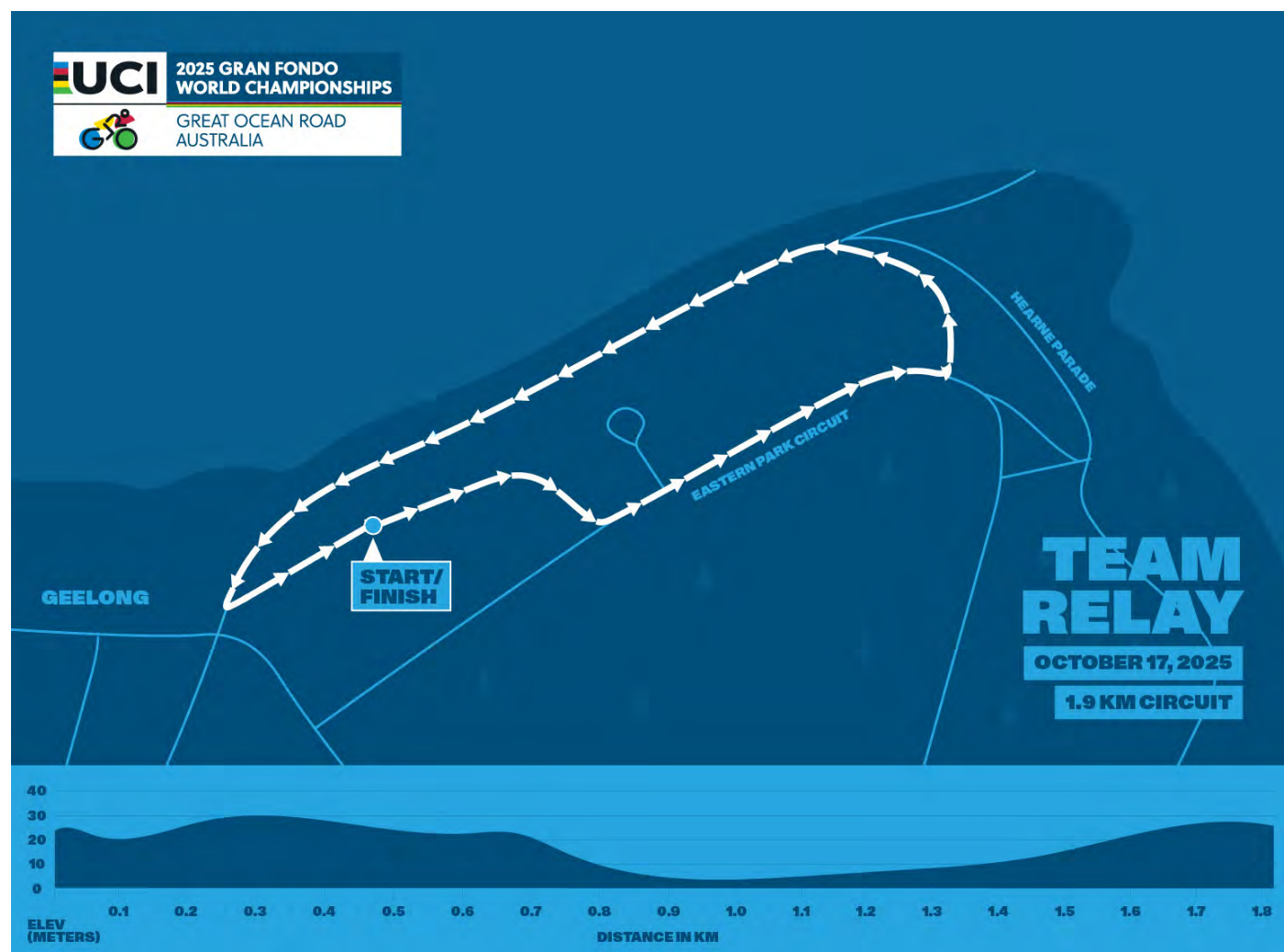
How does it work?

Teams are made up of four (4) riders of the same nationality. A maximum of 25 Teams can contest this event. The first rider of each team starts together on the start line. After three (3) laps, riders must enter the relay zone. From the moment the rider crosses the relay zone line, the next rider of that team can start their three laps. After the fourth (last) rider completes their third lap, they must cross the finish line.

ROAD RACE (SUNDAY)

Starting and finishing in Lorne on the Great Ocean Road the Gran Fondo is staged on a challenging yet rewarding course winding up and around the Otway Ranges before returning to sea level and finishing along Victoria's iconic coastline.

The course kicks things off with an uphill battle straight out of Lorne. There's another climb just after the halfway mark, followed by a well-earned descent onto the Great Ocean Road where you're rewarded with stunning views for the last 40km.

Riders assemble in their respective start boxes in accordance with their starting order, and per start group.</p> <p>The starting boxes will be clearly signed and open on a first come, first serve basis. The first row of each start group is reserved for the age group winners of the qualifier events and defending world champions, who will be able to access the first row from the sidewalk 5 minutes before their respective start.</p> <p>Marshals will be available to assist with Rider assembly however Riders are responsible for assembling in the correct start box. Riders starting in the wrong box will be disqualified.</p>
Start Procedures	<p>The start boxes will be separated by tape or fences which will be removed a few minutes before the respective starts. After removal of the tape/fence, the next start group will be instructed to move forward to the start arch.</p> <p>The start time for all riders in a same start group is the gun-time of that specific group, and not the moment each rider crosses the start line.</p>

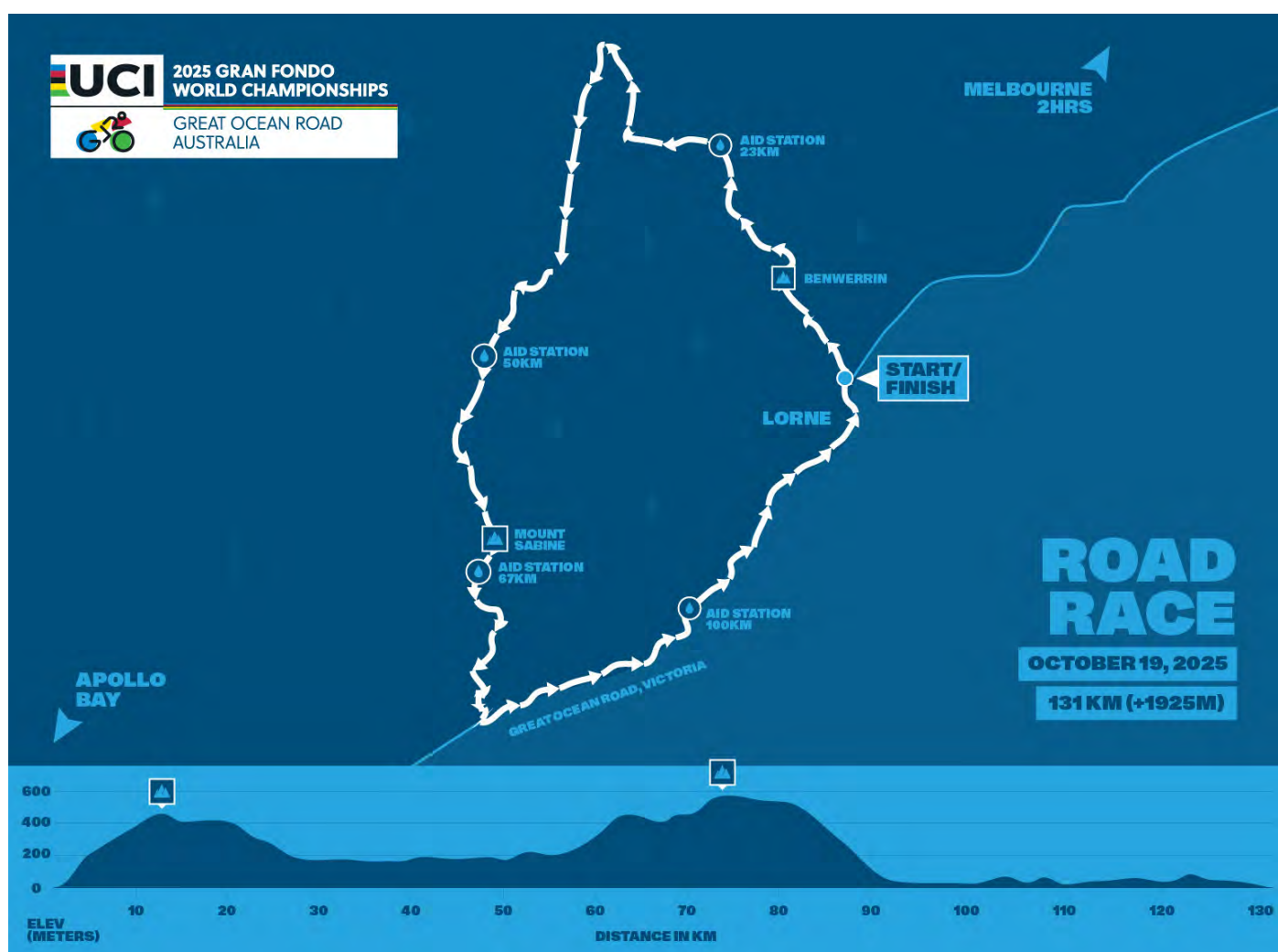

Rubbish Zones

A rubbish zone will be clearly sign posted from 50m prior and 50m after each Aid Station. Riders can only discard waste within this area. Riders observed littering outside of the Rubbish Zones will be disqualified.

UCI GENERAL REGULATIONS

The 2025 UCI Gran Fondo World Championships will be conducted under **UCI Regulations**.
The following is a summary of key Regulations for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.

AGE GROUP CATEGORIES

The age categories of the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are:
19-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89

Age groups applicable to the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are defined by the riders' age on December 31st of the year of the World Championships.

Each age category has a different colour of race numbers. The colours are to indicate to riders who they are competing against during the race. Men and Women of the same age category have the same colour race number.

19 - 34	60 - 64
35 - 39	65 - 69
40 - 44	70 - 74
45 - 49	75 - 79
50 - 54	80+
55 - 59	

LICENCES

Riders taking part in the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships must hold a valid racing licence issued by their respective national federation (day licences being excluded), must hold a UCI ID and must be adequately insured against accidents and civil responsibility (called public liability in Australia) in the country in which the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships are held.

Riders should also bring a proof of their licence (physical licence, printed form, online proof) showing their UCI ID. Participation with a day licence or a licence of a federation not affiliated to the UCI is not possible.

NATIONAL JERSEYS

Riders shall wear the national jersey representing their nationality (and not their country of residence or licence affiliation, should it differ from the latter). Although the official national jersey is not required, the jersey should visually represent the athlete's country, with a similar design and colours. Club and private sponsors are authorised to appear on the jerseys. A club jersey with a flag is not considered as a national jersey. Refer invitation from UCI and confer with your National Federation if you have any questions.

It is forbidden to wear the rainbow stripes or any variation of their design on the jersey (sleeves/collar), bike, helmet, shoes or overshoes during the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.

MEDAL CEREMONIES

The three first riders of every age category (women and men) will be called to the podium to be awarded prizes. The presentation order will be from old to young, alternating men and women.

- Riders must wear their cycling outfit (jersey + shorts)
- No glasses, hats, caps, open shoes
- No publicity sticker on the jersey during the ceremony

All World Champions are invited to stay after their age group's podium for an overall picture with all World Champions.

TIMING

All riders in the same start group receive the gun time as their start time. Finish times are recorded via your timing chip as you pass over the timing point at the finish line. Timing chips will be issued at rider registration. Do not tamper or remove the chip or you may not receive a finish time and will be classed as a DNF (Did Not Finish). Timing chips however, should be removed and returned to the 'Timing Chip Return Point' at the conclusion of each race. Failing to do so will incur an \$80 Replacement fee, and no official time will be awarded.

HELMET USE

Anytime you are riding your bike in Australia you must wear your helmet. This is an Australia-wide law, enforceable by Police and subject to fines. Riders also risk immediate withdrawal from the event if caught by a member of the organisation without their helmet.

NEUTRAL SUPPORT

Neutral support cars and motos will be called through via the Commissaires via radio and will respond where safe and timely to do so. Not all start groups will have neutral support therefore all Riders are advised to bring spare tubular/tyre and pump/canister.

- It's forbidden to have your personal car following you during the race
- Neutral support during the Time Trial and Team Relay will be at fixed locations halfway along the course.

DOPING CONTROL

All riders are subject to doping control and may be requested at any time to provide a sample. Chaperones will wait for riders having to go to doping control, but it's the riders' responsibility to check if he/she must go to doping control.

Doping Control Locations

Geelong – Pavillion Geelong

Lorne – Mantra Hotel, Lorne

BIKE REGULATIONS

The riders must race with a road bike. In the road race event, time trial bikes are forbidden.

For the time trial, all bikes will be checked for compliance with the UCI's regulations. Summary of the UCI bike regulation for Time Trials are below:

A fixed extension may be added to the steering-system;

- **Category 1: Less than 180.0 cm tall:**

For riders less than 180.0 cm tall, the horizontal distance between the vertical planes passing through the bottom bracket axle and the extremity of the fixed time trial extension handlebar, including all accessories, may be a maximum of 800 mm. The height difference between the midpoint of the forearm support and the highest or lowest point of the extension (including accessory) must be less than 100 mm.

- **Category 2: Between 180.0 cm and 189.9 cm tall:**

For riders between 180.0 cm and 189.9 cm tall, the horizontal distance between the vertical planes passing through the bottom bracket axle and the extremity of the fixed time trial extension handlebar, including all accessories, may be a maximum of 830 mm. The height difference between the midpoint of the forearm support and the highest or lowest point of the extension (including accessory) must be less than 120 mm. Riders in Category 2 must submit a rider height attestation application form available from the UCI website.

- **Category 3: 190.0 cm and taller:**

For riders 190.0 cm and taller: the horizontal distance between the vertical planes passing through the bottom bracket axle and the extremity of the fixed time trial extension handlebar, including all accessories, may be a maximum of 850 mm. The height difference between the midpoint of the and the highest or lowest point of the extension (including accessory) must be less than 140 mm.

All bikes (both time trial and road race) will have to comply with the rules as explained in the [UCI infographic](#).

Note, the rule to register a category height at the UCI will not be applied at the 2025 Gran Fondo World Championships.

Riders that fall into Cat 2 or Cat 3 are encouraged to have their bike measurements checked at the Informal Bike Check. See event schedule for times.

BIKE CHECK

Commissaires will conduct the mandatory bike check for Time Trial bikes in the Bike Check tent adjacent to the Time Trial start ramp. Random checks will also be conducted at all races to detect technical fraud (motors) and bike weight checks (minimum bike is 6.8 kilos without bottles and GPS device).

An informal Bike Check tent will be available in Lorne on Wednesday 15 October for Time Trial riders to have their bike checked in relation to the UCI bike regulations for Time Trial bikes. Note: this is not a bike set up service. Bikes should be assembled and ready for inspection. This opportunity does not replace the mandatory bike check by Commissaires at the start line on Time Trial race day.

EVENT SERVICES

REGISTRATION & RIDER PACKS

All riders must present at Registration to have their licence checked and collect their Rider Pack. You will need photo ID (driver's licence or passport) and UCI ID.

The Rider Pack will include the timing transponder, body number, pins, and stickers for the helmet, seat post and bag drop. Refer to the Event Schedule on *page 11* for the Registration opening hours.

INFORMATION DESK

An information desk will be co-located in the Registration area and open at the same times as Registration. On Sunday the information desk will be located in the Event Village.

RIDER BRIEFINGS

Rider briefings are offered prior to each race. The briefings are not compulsory; however, they are a great opportunity to listen and ask questions about the course, start procedures, wave starts, rules, safety hazards, and other pertinent race-specific information. All briefing slides will be emailed if you cannot attend in person.

LOST & FOUND

Lost items should be taken to the information tent in the main event village in Lorne. At the conclusion of the event, unclaimed items will be donated to local charities or otherwise safely disposed of.

MEDICAL & FIRST AID

Medical Edge have been appointed to service the event, complementing dedicated Ambulance Victoria (AV) resources.

The main medical centre is located at the Event Village in Lorne. The medical centre will open Wednesday 12:00-17:00, Thursday 9:00-17:00, Saturday 10:00-16:30 and Sunday 07:00-16:30. The medical centre will not be open on Friday.

Lorne Community Hospital (Lorne) and Barwon Hospital (Geelong) have been notified of the event.

Medical resourcing is available at both the start/finish line and turnaround point for the Time Trial, at the Teams Relay, and at various locations around the Gran Fondo circuit.

TIMING & RESULTS

MultiSport Australia have been appointed as the timing and results contractor. Active timing chips will be issued as part of your Registration Kit and will need to be mounted to the front fork. Instructions and cable ties will be provided with the chip. Riders are encouraged to bring tape to apply to the fork to protect the surface. Timing chips must be returned to the 'Timing Chip Return Point' at the conclusion of each race. Failing to do so will incur an \$80 replacement fee, and no official time will be awarded.

The event uses the same course as the World Championship riders, with one small 10km section removed to assist with road closure re-openings. A brilliant opportunity for friends and family to ride the course of the world championship contenders vying for a rainbow jersey!

- **Distance:** 122km
- **Format:** Fully Closed Road Timed Recreational Ride
- **Minimum Age:** 16 years (Age at 19 Oct 2025)

Amy's Medio Fondo – 45kms (Apollo Bay to Lorne)

The Medio Fondo starts in Apollo Bay and finishes in Lorne travelling along the most scenic parts of the Great Ocean Road. The distance, terrain and sensational scenery of the Surf Coast and Colac Otway regions makes for a great day out on the bike.

- **Date:** Sunday 19 October 2025
- **Start Time:** 12:00
- **Start Location:** Hardy Street – Foreshore Parking Area, Apollo Bay, Victoria, Australia
- **Distance:** 45km
- **Format:** Fully Closed Road, Timed Recreational Ride.
- **Start Groups:** 18-20km/h, 21-25km/h, 26-30km/h, 30+km/h
- **Minimum Age:** 12 years (at 19 October 2025)

Amy's Family Ride – 3km Lorne Circuit

A free, family-friendly event taking place on the same morning as the 2025 UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. Riders will start under the Gran Fondo Road Race gantry and head toward the iconic Lorne Pier.

- **Date:** Sunday 19th October 2025
- **Start Line Open:** 09:20 (50 minutes permitted on course – Finish Line closes at 10:10)
- **Start Location:** Main Street, Lorne
- **Distance:** 3km Circuit
- **Format:** Fully Closed Road Recreational Ride
- **Minimum Age:** 6 years (at 19 October 2025 – Must be accompanied by a guardian).
Registered riders must be at least 6 years of age at the date of the event to participate in the Family Fondo, passengers can be younger than this if carried in road safe carrier.
