# 1. INTRODUCTION

This document provides an overview of requirements for a club hosting a Bronze BMX Racing event. It is critical to read this document in line with the [AusCycling Organisers Guide \(General and BMX Racing Specific\)](#) and [AusCycling Technical Regulations \(General and BMX Racing Specific\)](#).

# 2. DEFINITION OF A BRONZE EVENT

A Bronze level event is an event involving multiple clubs and is an open event that does not form part of the State or Territory Series. The events can be interclub or region-based competitions.

Bronze level events can also include:

- Regional Championships or Series
- State/Territory Championships for speciality categories (as defined in the Technical Regulations)
- City or Country Championships Challenge

# 3. REGISTERING A BRONZE EVENT

An initial registration period will take place for bronze level events each year after the confirmation of the calendar of International, Platinum, Gold and Silver level events.

Where two clubs from the same region are seeking to host on the same date the process will be used to determine priority:

- [The Date Protection Table](#) (see Section 4)
- Historical Dates: Any club who has hosted previously on the date will be provided date priority.
- AusCycling Assessment: Assessment of AusCycling based on other events in the calendar.

After the close of the initial application period a club can still apply to host a bronze level event at any time on a first come – first serve basis. If there are no conflicts the date will automatically be granted to the host.

All Club's hosting a bronze event must complete the [Application Form – BMX Bronze Events](#). Applications should be submitted at least six (6) weeks prior to the commencement of the event, unless exempted by AusCycling.

When registering to hold a bronze level event, clubs must ensure they meet the minimum standards relating to the Technical Guide, Officials and Medical, as outlined in the [AusCycling Organisers Guide \(BMX Racing Specific\)](#).

## 4. CALENDAR AND DATE PROTECTION

The club can choose any date they wish to deliver a bronze level event, providing it does not conflict with the following date protection rules.

Type of Event	Class of Event	Event Code	Date Protection
International Competition	UCI	UCI	During any registered UCI events no ST or S event can be run in the same State/Territory.  During any registered UCI events no R or C event can take place in the same State/Territory.
National Championships	Platinum Event	CN	During CN events no ST, S or R event can take place anywhere in Australia.  During CN events no C event can take place in the same State/Territory.
National Series	Gold Event	NC	During NC events no ST or S event can take place in Australia.  During NC events no R event can take place in the same State/Territory.  During NC events no C event can take place in the same Region.
State/Territory Championships	Silver Event	ST	During ST designated events no S, R or C event can take place within the same State/Territory.
State/Territory Series	Silver Event	S	During S designated event dates no R or C event can take place in the same Region.
<b>Interclub Events</b>	<b>Bronze Event</b>	<b>R</b>	<b>During R designated event dates, no other R or C event can be run within the same Region (specifications as set in each state/territory).</b>
Club Events	Club Event	C	No restrictions on Club Events.

An event day is only considered to be the day on which racing takes place.

Date protection is provided for the region in which the club is located. Specific Regions within each State/Territory are outlined in **Section 8** of this document.

## 6. SANCTIONING FEES AND CHARGES

A \$49 fee per event will be charged for every bronze level event at the time of application. There are no other sanctioning fees payable to AusCycling. This fee is payable at the time of application

## 7. FAILURE TO MEET DELIVERY STANDARDS

Failure to meet the minimum delivery standards listed in the [AusCycling Organisers Guide \(BMX Racing Specific\)](#) will result in a one year suspension of the rights of a club to host any Bronze level event or above and may place the event insurance coverage in jeopardy.
