

2025 AusCycling Victoria Junior Road Series (VJRS)

EVENT GUIDE

OVERVIEW

The Santini Victorian Junior Road Series (VJRS) is a critical part of the junior road racing structure and pathway. The following are the series specific regulations for Victoria.

STATE SERIES ROUNDS - VICTORIA

- Round 1 – 12-13 April – Alpe de Buffalo – Alpine Cycling Club
- Round 2 – 14-15 June – Broadford Junior Tour – AusCycling
- Round 3 – 18-20 July – Eildon Junior Tour – Blackburn Cycling Club
- Round 4 – 9-10 August – 2024 Junior Road State Championships (Glenrowan) – Carnegie Caulfield Cycling Club
- Round 5 – 6-7 September – TBC

STATE SERIES ROUNDS - VICTORIA

Riders must race a minimum of three VJRS rounds to be considered eligible for series prizes.

To be eligible for series points riders must:

- Be a primary member of a club based in Victoria
- Have a 'Race All Discipline' membership and are aged in the recognised categories.
- The rider must not be registered in the Junior Road Series of a different state during the same season (A rider can only pursue one Junior Road Series per season). Riders are automatically registered to compete in the series in which their primary club is located. Riders wishing to compete in a different state's Junior Road Series must submit their request in writing to events@auscycling.org.au

STATE SERIES POINTS - VICTORIA

Points System

The points for the Santini Junior Road Series will be awarded based on the overall finishing in each round.

Bonus points will be awarded in all categories for each stage finish at a Tour (Rounds 1-4).

Riders not completing or starting Tour Stages

During a Tour, riders who don't finish (DNF), start (DNS) or are relegated due to failing gear restrictions at any stage may be allowed to continue the tour at the discretion of the Chief Commissaire but will be ineligible for series points or the general classification of the tour.

Riders who are disqualified will not be allowed to continue a race.

STATE SERIES POINTS CALCULATION

State Series points will be calculated by adding the total points earned on each Round and adding all bonus points earned per rider.

Combined Categories

In the scenario where categories have been combined at an event, points will be awarded separately. For example, if A and B grade are combined, B grade riders earn points in B grade and A grade riders will earn points in A grade.

Riders Changing Grades

- Riders of the Junior 15 or Junior 17 categories that move or are promoted from B to A grade during the series will keep one third (1/3) of their series points previously scored in B grade.
- Riders of the Junior 15 or Junior 17 categories that move or are demoted from A to B grade during the series will not retain any series points previously scored in A grade.

Tie Break

Where competitors share the same number of total series points, ties will be broken using the following method:

1. The competitor with the highest number of first place finishes at stage/standalone events.
2. The competitor with the highest number of second places at stage/standalone events.
3. The competitor with the highest number of third places at stage/standalone events.
4. If still tied, the placing in the last event will determine the ranking.

SERIES CATEGORIES OVERALL

The Series Categories that make up each round are:

Category	Grade	Age Eligibility (as of 31 December 2025)
Under 17 Women	A + B	15-16
Under 17 Men	A + B	15-16
Under 15 Women	A + B	13-14
Under 15 Men	A + B	13-14
Under 13 Girls*		11-12
Under 13 Boys*		11-12

*Junior 13 Girls and Boys will be combined at all events with results and series points being awarded separately. The event host is entitled to offer additional categories (for example J11 or J19) at their event. However, no series points will be awarded for these categories.

RIDING UP

Riding up is not permitted in Victorian Junior Series events.

GRADING

- Junior 15 and Junior 17 riders will be graded (A or B) by AusCycling at the first series event they participate in based on their recent performance and results.
- Riders may be promoted or demoted during the series at the discretion of AusCycling (published along with the Series Standings after each round).
- Riders will not be promoted after Round 4 if they have participated and placed in at least 2 previous rounds.

STATE SERIES AWARDS

Riders in the recognised categories who meet the series qualification requirements and finish in the below mentioned placings will receive the following prizing:

Awards will be presented at the final round of the 2025 Victorian Junior Road Series.

EVENT PRIZES

Specific event awards may be provided by and set by each event host.
