1. OVERVIEW

The AusCycling Santini Junior Road State/Territory Series events are a critical part of the Racing competition structure and pathway. The following are the series specific regulations for South Australia.

2. SERIES ROUNDS

- 1. Round 1 | May 3 & 4 | Tour of the Riverland, Berri (Bonus points for Stages)
- 2. Round 2 | May 17 & 18 | 100 Mile Classic (Bonus points for Stages). Mt Gambier
- 3. Round 3 | July 5 & 6 | South Coast Junior Tour (Bonus points for Stages), McLaren Vale
- 4. Round 4 | September 28 | The Bend, Tailem Bend as part of the Super Series
- 5. Round 5 | October 25 & 26 | Loxton (Bonus points for Stages) as part of the Super Series
- 6. Round 6 | November 8 | Mypolonga as part of the Super Series
- 7. Championships are not included in this Series.

3. SERIES QUALIFICATION

- 1. To have your place recognised in the Santini Junior Road Series (SA):
- 2. The rider must be a primary member of a club in SA. Participation in all events is open to all riders within the appropriate age groups.
 - a. The rider must have earned points to appear in the series standings.
- 3. The rider must not be registered in the Series of a different state during the same season (A rider can only pursue one State/Territory Junior Road Series per season). Riders are automatically registered to compete in the series in which their primary club is located. Riders wishing to compete in a different state's Junior Road Series must submit their request in writing to events@auscycling.org.au

4. SERIES POINTS

Series points will be calculated by adding the total points earned at each Round and adding all bonus points earned, per rider.

4.1 ROUND POINTS

The points for the Series will be awarded based on the finishing place at each Round in accordance with the following table:

Points will be awarded to all finishing riders per stage/round, however only riders meeting the State Series Qualification will be formally placed.

4.2 TOUR POINTS

Where a round has more than one stage, the organiser may choose to award an overall classification using the below table of points. These points will not go towards a rider's series tally.

This applies to: Round 1, Round 2 & Round 5. South Coast Junior Tour is not included and is based on time.

Points will be awarded to all finishing riders per stage/round, however only riders meeting the State Series Qualification will be formally placed.

4.3 BONUS POINTS



Bonus points will be awarded in all categories for finish positions within each Stage on multi-stage weekends, as follows:

1 st	8
2 nd	5
3 rd	4
4 th	3
5 th	2
6 th	1

4.4 RIDERS NOT COMPLETING TOUR STAGES

Riders who have been permitted to continue in a Tour after DNS/DNF will not earn points on any subsequent stages.

4.5 COMBINED CATEGORIES

In the scenario where categories have been combined at an event (for whatever reason), points will be awarded separately. For example, if JW15 and JM15 have combined into one race, the combined result will be separated into a result for each category, with the full Series Points allocation applied to each.

4.6 TIE-BREAK

Should any riders finish on the same number of points at the end of the series, the tie will be broken by way of countback as follows:

- The number of 1st places achieved.
- The number of 2nd places achieved.
- The number of 3rd places achieved.
- The number of races started.

Should the tie remain after the countback, the riders will receive the same placing in the Series.

5. EVENT CATEGORIES

The Event Categories that will be conducted within each Series round and will be recognized accordingly in series points, are as listed below:

Junior 11 & Junior 9 will not be part of the Series but may be recognised by the host club.

5.1. RIDING UP

Riding up is not permitted in State/Territory Junior Series events.

6. GRADING

The Series is ungraded however some rounds/races may be graded depending on entry numbers and format.

7. SERIES AWARDS

Final places in Santini Junior Road Series (SA) will be awarded as follows:

7.1. AWARD PRESENTATIONS

Awards will be presented at Round 6, Mypolonga.

8. EVENT AWARDS

Vouchers will be provided to podium placegetters for each Round of the Series.
