# INDEPENDENT AND FEDERATION ENTRY SELECTION CRITERION

2025 UCI World Cup XCO

### **PREAMBLE**

This criterion should be read in conjunction with the <u>Privateer and Independent Athlete Policy</u>. The policy provides general information on eligibility, extenuating circumstances, and clothing requirements.

AusCycling administers entries for XCO World Cup events for Australian riders not on UCI World Series and UCI MTB Teams. This includes riders that have qualified for independent entry under UCI regulations. Riders that have not qualified must apply for a Federation entry. Riders on UCI World Series and UCI MTB teams are entered by their team. **See Table 1 for full information on qualifying and Federation entry quotas.** 

Federation entries are provided by the UCI to National Federations and are the equivalent of National Team entries, similar to World Championships. As a result, there are minimum standards, a selection process, and specific mandatory requirements that must be met to be eligible. Federation entries are limited and demand for entries often exceeds the number of places available. All riders are advised to carefully read and understand all the information below.

### 1. MANDATORY EVENT REQUIREMENTS (Federation Entries Only)

1.1. To be eligible for a <u>federation entry</u> applicants **MUST** compete in the following events **or** apply for exemption for extenuating circumstances as outlined in the <u>Privateer and</u> <u>Independent Athlete Policy</u>.

### 1.1.1. Elite Men and Women XCO

- 2025 AusCycling XCO National Championships (Elite category) AND
- 2025 Oceania XCO Championships (Elite category)

### 1.1.2. U23 Men and Women XCO

- 2025 AusCycling XCO National Championships (Elite or U23 category) AND
- 2025 Oceania XCO Championships (Elite or U23 category)

### 2. MINIMUM PERFORMANCE STANDARDS (Federation Entries Only)

2.1. To be eligible for a <u>federation entry</u> applicants **MUST** meet at least 1 of the following minimum performance standards <u>on at least 2 separate occasions</u> or apply for exemption for extenuating circumstances as outlined in <u>Privateer and Independent Athlete Policy</u>.

### 2.1.1. Elite Men and Women XCO

- Finish on the lead lap at any event listed in 1.1.1. OR
- Finish on the lead lap in any UCI listed Continental Series, HC, C1 or C2 XCO event during 2024/25 (Elite category, or U23 category in 2024 if the applicant is a first year Elite in 2025)

### 2.1.2. U23 Men and Women XCO

- Finish on the lead lap at any event listed in 1.1.2. OR
- Finish on the lead lap of any UCI listed Continental Series, HC, C1 or C2 XCO event during 2024/25 (Elite or U23 category) OR
- Finish on the lead lap of any UCI listed Continental Series, HC, C1, C2 or Junior Series event in 2024 (Junior category, first year U23s in 2025 only)

### 3. FEDERATION ENTRY SELECTION PROCESS

3.1. Entry allocation will be made using the following process and criteria:

### 3.1.1. Elite Men and Women XCO

Entries will be allocated as per dates listed in table 2 below from applications received using the following criteria:

1) Eligible athletes in order of UCI ranking at each respective allocation dates.

### 3.1.2. U23 Men and Women XCO

Entries will be allocated as per dates listed in table 2 below from applications received using the following criteria (in order):

- 1) Any athletes selected for a 2025 AusCycling Pathways project (only applicable to World Cups included in the Pathways project)
- 2) If any entries remain after clause 1, eligible athletes in order of UCI ranking at each respective allocation dates.
- 3.1.3. Any remaining entries from applications received after each allocation round will be allocated on a first come first serve basis during the season. Closing date for any subsequent allocations of remaining federation entries is 3 weeks prior to each UCI Mountain Bike World Cup.
- 3.2. AusCycling reserves the right to allocate federation entries to riders who were granted exemption from attending mandatory events in extraordinary circumstances.
- 3.3. Riders who are allocated federations entries who subsequently cannot race due to injury, illness, changed travel plans or any other circumstance **MUST** notify AusCycling's MTB Operations Manager immediately so entries can be allocated to the next rider in line. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of any other federation entries allocated and ineligibility to apply again in the future.

### 4. INDEPENDENT ATHLETE ENTRIES

Athletes that have qualified for entry through the UCI system (see table below for details) can request entry processing using the application form in clause 5.

### 5. APPLICATIONS

Applications for Federation entry allocation and requests for qualified independent athlete entries can be made via the form <u>HERE</u>.
