SECTION 3 – EVENT REGULATIONS

General Regulations

Any infringement of any race rules and regulations by any competitor, team official or helper will make them liable to such penalties as set down in the AusCycling/UCI scale of penalties.

The Commissaires Panel will be managed by the Chief Commissaire who has been designated by AusCycling. The Chief Commissaire will allocate the specific duties to the members of the Commissaire's panel, which may include but are not limited to, Principal Commissaires, Starter and Chief Judge.

All events will be run without regard for the weather, with the exception of extreme weather conditions. In this case, the UCI's Extreme Weather Protocol and AusCycling's Heat Policy will be consulted, and a decision will be made between the Event Management Team, the Chief Commissaire, and Emergency Services.

All races will start promptly at the advertised times with count down times being announced at the start area from 30 minutes before the start of each stage.

Riders are reminded that it is unlawful and an offence against public decency to urinate in public places. Penalties will be imposed on those who choose to ignore this law.

Important Notice

All riders and team staff must complete and sign an indemnity form before entering the Phillip Island GP Circuit, these will be emailed and also available at registration, race numbers will not be allocated until the riders form is completed.

Technical Regulations

1. Organisation

The Tour of Gippsland/ Victoria Championships are organised by KSJ Event Management, under the regulations of AusCycling and the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI). The is to be held Saturday 9 August.

2. Type of Event

The event is the Victorian State Individual Time Trial and Road Race Championships. The events will be conducted under the rules and regulations of AusCycling and the UCI. The AusCycling/UCI scale of penalties will apply. For more information, please refer to the AusCycling website (www.auscycling.org.au) and UCI website (www.uci.org). Penalties have recently changed and been updated – please take the time to understand these updates.

3. Participation

The event is open to the following:

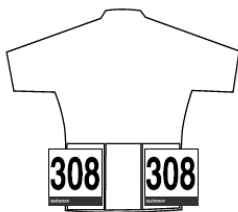
1. Open Men
2. Open Women
3. U19 Men and Women
4. U23 Men and Women
5. Master's 1 – 10 Categories for Men and Women

4. Race Numbers / Timing & Results

Each competitor will be issued with two body numbers, 1 frame number and a transponder. For the ITT one body number is to be placed on the lower centre of the back. The frame number must be secured on the seat post or attached to the rear brake assembly. The transponder must be placed as low as possible on either front fork. Numbers must be visible at all times.

Riders must not cut or fold numbers in any way.

Transponders must be returned to the finish line at the completion of the final stage of the tour. Teams/riders will be charged \$100 for each transponder not returned within 7 days.

5. Membership Holders

All official race personnel (i.e. managers, team staff and officials) driving in the race convoy must be a member of AusCycling or their National Federation.

No competitor will be allowed to start without producing a current, 2025 AusCycling membership or UCI licence, which must be presented to the Chief Commissaire at Registration.

6. Medical Services

Medical Motos will provide medical services at the race circuit.

8. Littering

Riders must not discard bidons or rubbish of any kind on the roadside. Teams must take responsibility for their own litter and return it to their team vehicles.

Riders found to be littering will be fined in accordance with local laws and AusCycling regulations.

9. Toilet Behaviour

Riders are advised that it is an offence to urinate in public. Toilets will be provided at each start/finish line for riders and team support staff to use.

Penalties will be imposed on those who choose to ignore this law.

General Race Day Information

Entry into the GP Circuit will be via Gate 7.

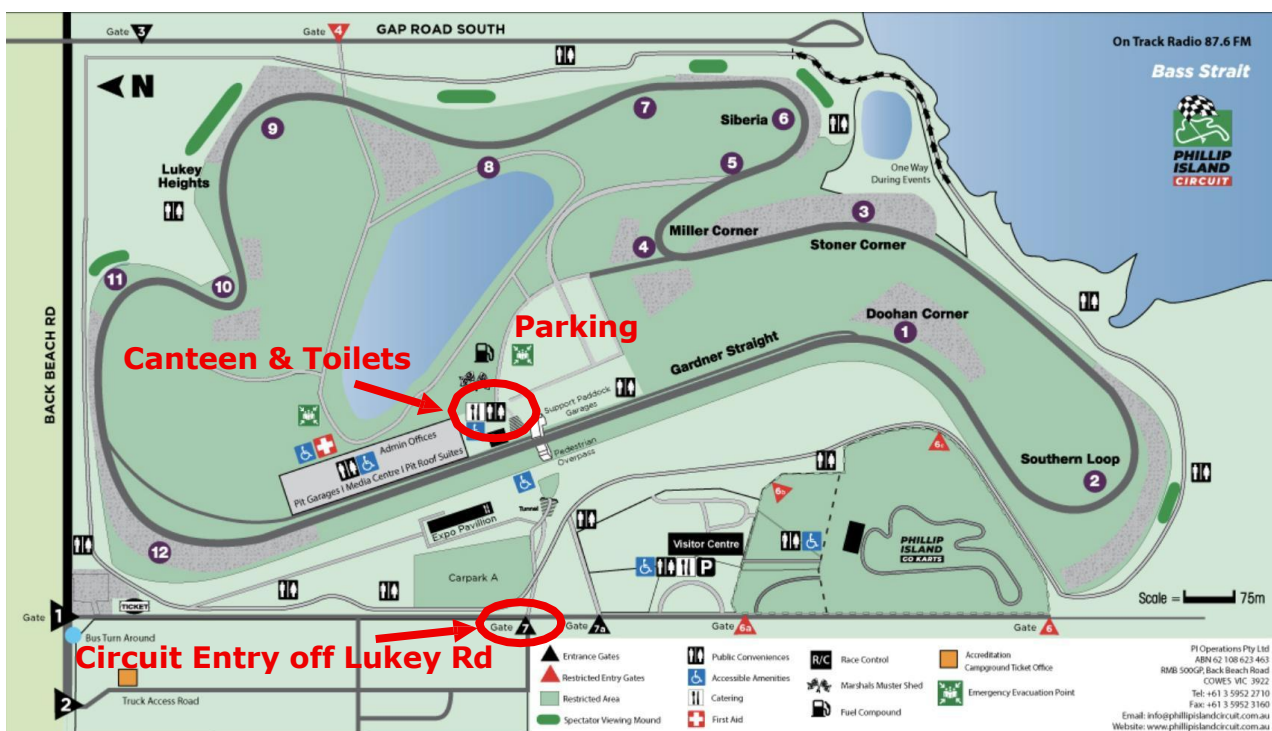
Parking will be available on the inside of the track in the support paddock, please follow managed traffic signals.

Public Toilets are located near the canteen and parking.

Food and Drink. The onsite canteen will be operating all day the circuit owner.

Pit Sheds will be open and available to the riders for warm-up / warm-down. Power is available.

Circuit Distance one full lap of the circuit is approx. 4.45 km

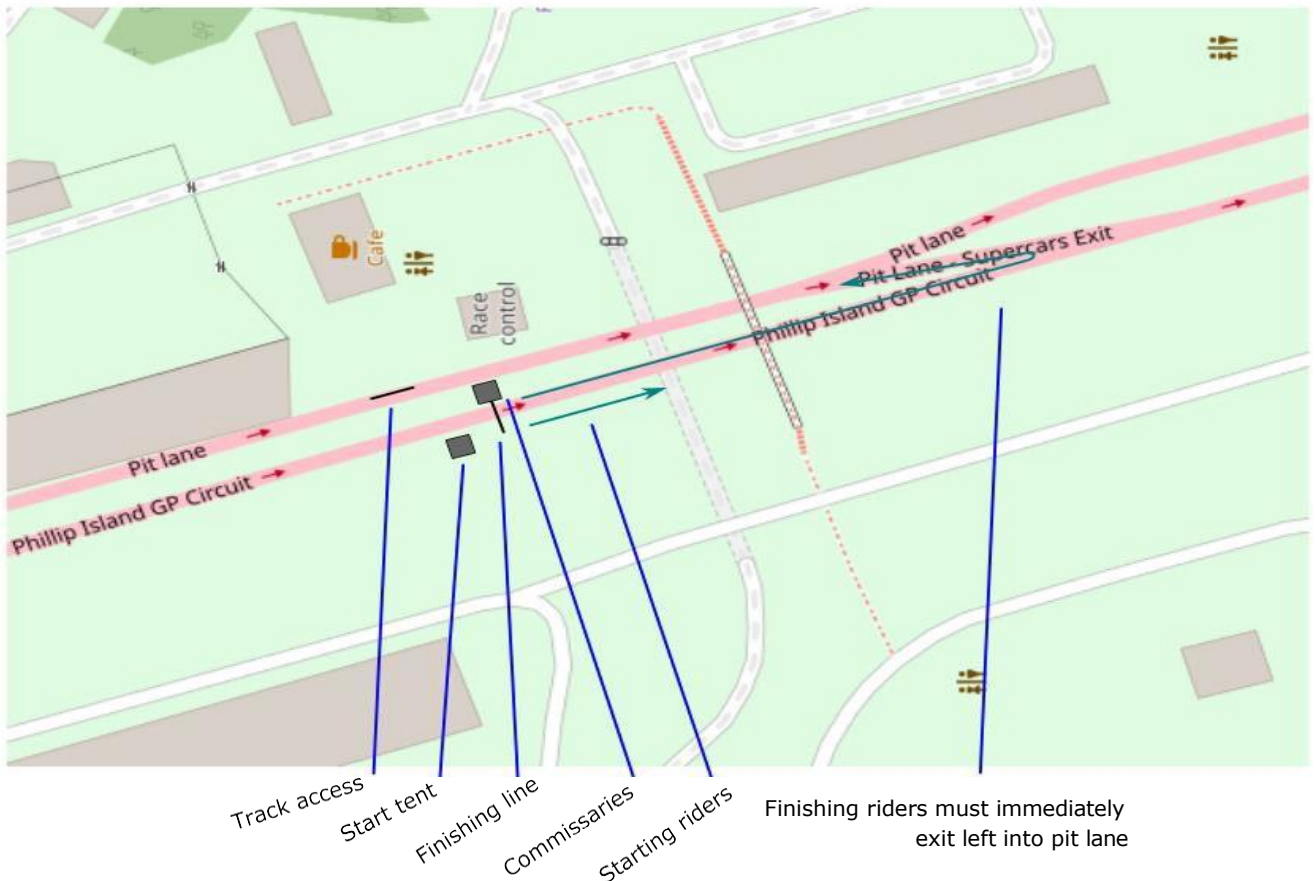
Course Map and Profile



Individual Time Trial Start / Finish area

The start and finish line are adjacent to each other. Starting and finishing protocols will be in place to ensure no rider is impeded at the start, during or finish of their individual time trial:

- The ITT starting tent will be located on the western side of the track. Competitors only will be allowed to cross the race track to line up for their scheduled start.
- Riders will finish on the eastern side of the track and must immediately exit to the left into pit lane following completion of their race.



- Riders must Register at least 30 minutes prior to their race start time.
- The track will be closed to all riders from **8.30am** in preparation for racing. The pit sheds will be open (and allocated) to riders for warm-up/warm-down prior to their scheduled start.
- The first rider will depart at **9.00am** as per schedule listed earlier in this technical guide
- There will be one-minute intervals between the start times of riders and no breaks between age groups. Individual Time Trial start times for each rider will be published prior to the event.

- The road will be **FULLY CLOSED** so riders will be able to use the full width of the road during racing, however, there will be officials on the course (motorbike) and the occasional vehicle (swag wagon, first aid where required) so riders need to take care at all times.
- Riders are advised to report to the marshalling area close to the start line at least 15 minutes prior to your time trial start time to complete rollout and have your name recorded as present.
- **NO** support vehicles, parents or spectators are to follow any competitor **THIS INCLUDES ON BICYCLE.**
- Any rider who receives outside assistance from anyone other than appointed officials will face disqualification and possible fine.
- For riders competing in both the Individual Time Trial and the Road Race, please hold on to your numbers and transponders until completion of your Road Race.

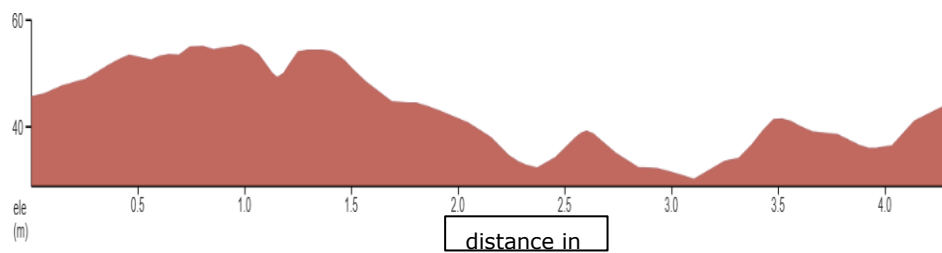
