**Series Guide**



## OVERVIEW

The BBB Cycling Victorian Junior Road Series (VJRS) is a critical part of the junior road racing structure and pathway. The following are the series specific regulations for Victoria.

## STATE SERIES ROUNDS - VICTORIA

- Round 1 – 11-12 April – Alpe de Buffalo – Alpine Cycling Club - Bright
- Round 2 – 10 May – Sandown Ft Mother's Day Classic Women's Road Race – Carnegie Caulfield Cycling Club - Sandown
- Round 3 – 13-14 June – Broadford Junior Tour – AusCycling - Broadford
- Round 4 – 10-12 July – Eildon Junior Tour – Blackburn Cycling Club - Eildon
- Round 5 – 08-09 August – 2026 Junior Road State Championships – Carnegie Caulfield Cycling Club – Phillip Island

## ELIGIBILITY

Riders must start a minimum of three BBB Cycling VJRS rounds to be considered eligible for series prizes.

To be included on the Victorian state series tally, riders must:

- Be a primary member of a club based in Victoria
- Have a 'Race All Discipline' membership and be aged in the recognised categories.
- The rider must not be registered in the Junior Road Series of a different state during the same season (A rider can only pursue one Junior Road Series per season). Riders are automatically registered to compete in the series in which their primary club is located. ## STATE SERIES POINTS ALLOCATION

### Points System

The points for the BBB Cycling Victorian Junior Road Series will be awarded for Overall and Stage placings according to table.

#### Tour and Championship points:

### Riders not completing or starting Tour Stages

During a Tour, riders who don't finish (DNF), start (DNS) or are relegated due to failing gear restrictions at any stage may be allowed to continue the tour at the discretion of the Chief Commissaire but will be ineligible for series points or the general classification of the tour.

Riders who are disqualified will not be allowed to continue a race.

## STATE SERIES POINTS CALCULATION

State Series points will be calculated by adding the total points earned on each Round and adding all stage points earned per rider.

Championship points for Round 5 – Individual Time Trial and Road Race will be awarded separately.

Inter-state riders will not be included in state series points (Championship, Tour Overall & Stage).

### Example of result:

1<sup>st</sup> – Inter-State Rider – Not included in series points

2<sup>nd</sup> – Victorian Rider – Will receive 25 points + 8 Stage points (1<sup>st</sup> Place points)

3<sup>rd</sup> – Inter-State Rider – Not included in series points

4<sup>th</sup> – Victorian Rider – Will receive 22 points + 5 stage points (2<sup>nd</sup> Place points)

5<sup>th</sup> – Victorian Rider – Will receive 20 points + 4 stage points (3<sup>rd</sup> Place points)

### Tie Break

Where competitors share the same number of total series points, ties will be broken using the following method:

1. The competitor with the highest number of first place finishes at stage/standalone events.
2. The competitor with the highest number of second places at stage/standalone events.
3. The competitor with the highest number of third places at stage/standalone events.
4. If still tied, the placing in the last event will determine the ranking.

## SERIES CATEGORIES

The Series Categories that make up each round are:

Category	Age (as at 31 December 2026)
Women Under 17	15-16
Men Under 17	15-16
Women Under 15	13-14
Men Under 15	13-14
Under 13 Girls*	11-12
Under 13 Boys*	11-12

\*Under 13 Girls and Boys will be combined at all events with results and series points being awarded separately.

\*Other categories (Example U11, U19) run in conjunction with VJRS rounds will not score any points.

## RIDING UP

Riding up is not permitted in BBB Cycling Victorian Junior Series events.

## STATE SERIES AWARDS

Riders in the recognised categories who meet the series qualification requirements and finish in the below mentioned placings will receive the following prizing:

Prize	Placing
Trophies	1 <sup>st</sup> Place, 2 <sup>nd</sup> Place, 3 <sup>rd</sup> Place

Awards will be presented at the final round of the 2026 BBB Cycling Victorian Junior Road Series. If a participant is unable to collect their trophy at the final round, they may collect it from DISC Velodrome at a later date. Please note that trophies will not be shipped to participants.

## EVENT PRIZES

Specific event awards may be provided by and set by each event host.
