3 EVENT ENTRIES

3.1 EVENT CATEGORIES

The below categories will be run for the 2024 AusCycling BMX Racing State Championships Tasmania. For a category to be held, at least five (5) riders must be registered in that category.

The recognised Para BMX categories will be 8-13 and 14+ in both male and female categories. If the minimum category entries of three (3) is not reached, riders will participate within their age category with results calculated based on lap times in the first three (3) motos with Para BMX factors applied to determine the final placing within the recognised categories.

Please Note: In accordance with the [AusCycling Technical Regulations: BMX](#), Riders may only enter their correct racing age and gender category for the State/Territory Championships.

3.2 ENTRY PROCESS & COST

Entry will be online via EntryBoss only. Entries will be uploaded into Sqorz after entries have closed. It is the rider/rider's guardian's responsibility to ensure that their entry is correct. This includes transponder number, category, and plate number.

3.3 SCRATCHING & REFUNDS

3.5 BMX CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP – Tasmania

- All Clubs will automatically be entered.
- There is no entry form/entry fee required.

3.6 MEMBERSHIP

The events will be open to all riders holding an AusCycling Race Membership: All Disciplines or Off Road only. No four (4) week trial or day licenses are permitted.

3.7 TRANSPONDERS

- All riders (except Sprockets and Mini Wheelers) will need to provide their own transponder to enter this event.
- 20" and 24" bikes will need separate transponders unless prior approval has been received.
- It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is correctly fitted to their bike and is operational which includes an active [subscription](#). Transponders can be purchased [here](#).

3.8 RACE PLATES

- Race Plates will be issued by AusCycling and must be worn for the duration of the event, including any official practice sessions.
- All Riders will nominate their plate number (maximum 3 digits) when registering.
- Riders with duplicate plates in the same category may be required to add an 'X' on their plate number.
- Where a duplicate plate is identified, the following process will be used:
 - Where riders have an allocated plate number (i.e., 1N) and a category is merged, the rider who has earned the respective plate number in the designated category will keep that plate number, with the other rider required to add an 'X' to their plate or select an alternate plate number.
 - Where riders personally choose a plate number and two (2) or more riders select the same plate number, the following steps shall occur to determine who is required to add an 'X' on their race number, until the duplication is resolved:
 1. If a category is merged, the rider who entered into the designated category will keep that plate number.
 2. The rider who is a member of the host club will keep that plate number.
 3. The rider who is a member of the host state/territory will keep that plate number.
 4. The rider who entered the event first will keep that plate number.

3.9 EVENT REGISTRATION (SIGN ON)

- All riders are required to attend the Event Registration (sign on), prior to the commencement of their Official Practice session.
- All riders must take their bikes to the transponder checking station to register for the event.
- Riders entered in two (2) categories (i.e., 20" and 24") must take both bikes to register in both categories.
- Parents/guardians must scan Sprocket/Mini Wheeler membership at the transponder checking station, but they are not required to bring bikes with them.
- It is the responsibility of the rider/parent/guardian to check all details are correct at the transponder checking station.

4 RACE INFORMATION



3.1 RULES AND REGULATIONS

The event will be conducted under the BMX rules and regulations of AusCycling (AC) and the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI). This Technical Guide is supplementary to the following:

National/State level AusCycling event.

Sport Integrity Australia can conduct anti-doping testing at any event or competition. It is your responsibility to ensure you are aware of your obligations and have completed clean sport education.

All riders over 13 are strongly encouraged to complete Anti-Doping Fundamentals and the 2024 Annual Update online courses through the [Sport Integrity Australia eLearning page](#)

It is recommended you also download the Sport Integrity app which can assist you to check medications, supplements and complete your education.

3.2 RACE FORMAT

Current UCI Rules applies using Scrambled Moto transfer system for all categories except for participation. Block format may apply pending rider entries. Gate positions for Motos will be random computer drawn. Total points to end of motos followed by Qualifiers and Finals. Gate positions for Qualifiers and Finals are in order of lap time from the previous Stage or Round.

A category of one (1) full gate or less (i.e. eight (8) riders or less riders) will be run in accordance with section 2.03.03 a) of the [AusCycling Technical Regulations – BMX Racing](#). Noting awards / prizes will only be issued to competitors who ride in the extra moto/final.

The race format for the State/Territory Championships is as follows:

4.3 CORPORATE TEAM SCORING

Points Calculation for Corporate Teams will be as follows:

- Points will be awarded in each of the Motos and the Final (i.e. will not include Qualifiers) as follows:

2nd	18
3rd	16
4th	14

- Scores will be taken from the top four (4) riders from each Corporate Team, using the following conditions:
 - The top four (4) riders can come from any category (excluding Sprockets and Mini Wheelers).
 - For riders entering more than one (1) category the best results from one (1) of those categories will be considered.
 - For merged categories the points will be assigned in accordance with the entered category.
- In the event of a tie between Corporate Teams, the result will be decided by:
 - 1) Greatest number of 1st place results across the whole race
 - 2) Greatest number of 2nd place results across the whole race
 - 3) Greatest number of 3rd place results across the whole race
 - 4) Greatest number of 4th place results across the whole race
 - 5) Greatest number of 5th place results across the whole race
 - 6) Greatest number of 6th place results across the whole race
 - 7) Greatest number of 7th place results across the whole race
 - 8) Greatest number of 8th place results across the whole race
 - 9) An 'index' for riders is calculated by comparing the best time of each rider with the average time for the entry category of the rider. A faster than average best time results in a positive index. A slower than average best time results in a negative index. The indexes are totalled and the team with the most points is determined to be the winner.

4.4 BMX CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP SCORING

Points Calculation for the BMX Club Championship – Tasmania will be as follows:

- Points will be awarded in each of the Motos and the Final (i.e., will not include Qualifiers) as follows:

Scores will be taken from the top four (4) riders from each Club, using the following conditions:

The top four (4) riders can come from any category (excluding Sprockets and Mini Wheelers).

For riders entering more than one (1) category the best results from one (1) of those categories will be considered.



In the event of a tie between Clubs, the result will be decided by:

- 1) Greatest number of 1st place results across the whole race
- 2) Greatest number of 2nd place results across the whole race
- 3) Greatest number of 3rd place results across the whole race
- 4) Greatest number of 4th place results across the whole race
- 5) Greatest number of 5th place results across the whole race
- 6) Greatest number of 6th place results across the whole race
- 7) Greatest number of 7th place results across the whole race
- 8) Greatest number of 8th place results across the whole race
- 9) An 'index' for riders is calculated by comparing the best time of each rider with the average time for the entry category of the rider. A faster than average best time results in a positive index. A slower than average best time results in a negative index. The indexes are totalled and the team with the most points is determined to be the winner.

4.5 RIDERS ADVOCATE / PROTESTS

4.5.1 APPOINTMENT AND ROLE OF RIDERS ADVOCATE

A Riders Advocate (also known as Team Manager) will be appointed by the Technical Delegate for the 2024 AusCycling BMX Racing State Championships – Tasmania. The Riders Advocate represents a rider in relation to appeals concerning procedural matters. Where there are large number of riders attending the event, the Technical Delegate may also appoint additional Assistant Riders Advocates, in order to assist the Riders Advocate in their role.

4.5.2 PROCESS TO LODGE A PROTEST

All riders must approach the Riders Advocate to speak to officials if they have an issue / lodge a protest on their behalf. Protests can only be made on the results from the scoring medium showing the order in which the riders crossed the finish line, not the decisions of the commissaires panel that are noted in the results such as DNS (Did Not Start), DNF (Did Not Finish), REL (Relegated). Riders only have 15 minutes to protest once results are posted.

Protests regarding judgment decisions during a competition are not accepted. The commissaires in charge shall make decisions on the spot through the president of the commissaires' panel in case of any incidents or irregularities occurring during the competition.

5.2 ALLOCATION OF AWARDS & PRIZES

- Awards, prizing and prize pools will be issued based on **Entered Categories**.
- A rider is only eligible for the title and Jersey of State/Territory Champion in one state/territory based on their primary club (based on the State/Territory to which the primary club is allocated) if they have been part of the club for at least 3 months prior to the Championships.
- AC will publish a list post event on the [State/Territory Championships webpage](#), highlighting which riders will be able to register in events with which State/Territory plate number until the completion of the relevant 2025 AusCycling BMX State/Territory Championships.

5.3 DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS & PRIZING

All awards and prizing (excluding any prize money/prize pools) will be issued at the conclusion of the event.

Riders and Corporate Teams who are eligible to receive a prize money or prize pool payment, are to provide their payment details within seven (7) days of the conclusion of the event through the online form:

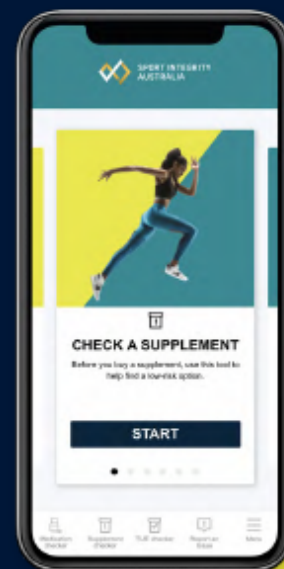

ANTI DOPING IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY



Medications may have banned substances in them. Check all medications on the Sport Integrity app.



All athletes are responsible for what substances they put into their own bodies - they can't blame anyone else, however if a coach has supplied the substance, penalties also apply to the coach.



Supplements are a huge risks. Research shows 1 in 5 contain a banned substance not listed on the label. Find low risk supplements on the Sport Integrity app. If it's not listed, don't risk it.



As a member of your sport, you are bound by an Anti-Doping Policy and potentially subject to investigation.



There are rules that you and your athletes must follow under your sport's Anti-Doping Policy. Details are in the Sport Integrity app menu under 'Know the rules'.



Anti-doping education should not be a 'tick the box' exercise - it should be an ongoing conversation with your athletes.



If you are involved in a team sport, and an athlete tests positive to a banned substance, the team could lose competition points and championship placings.



Breaking the rules could result in a ban of up to four years from ALL sport - no training, no playing, no coaching.

Use the Therapeutic Use Exemption Checker to see if you need a TUE, and complete the paperwork if required.

USING SUPPLEMENTS?

Use the 'Check a Supplement' tab to check the risk of your product. Supplements are the leading cause of inadvertent positive tests in Australia.

NEVER BEEN TESTED?

Prepare yourself by going through a virtual reality test on the App. (Search for it under the menu icon)

KNOW THE RULES?

A positive test is only one way to be banned from sport. Read up on the 11 Anti-Doping Rule Violations.
