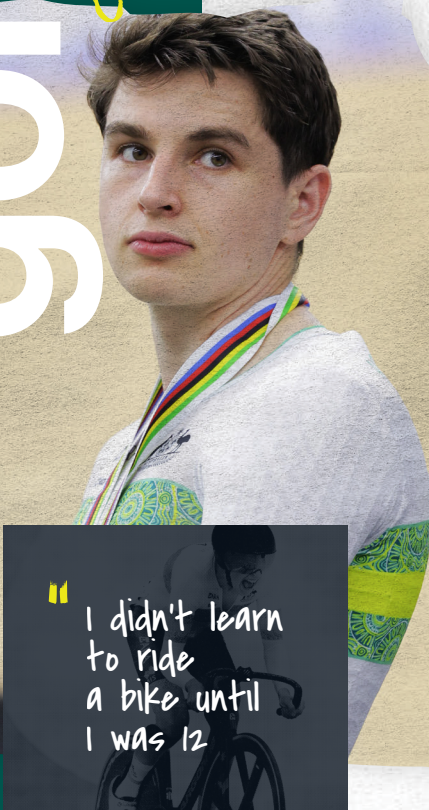

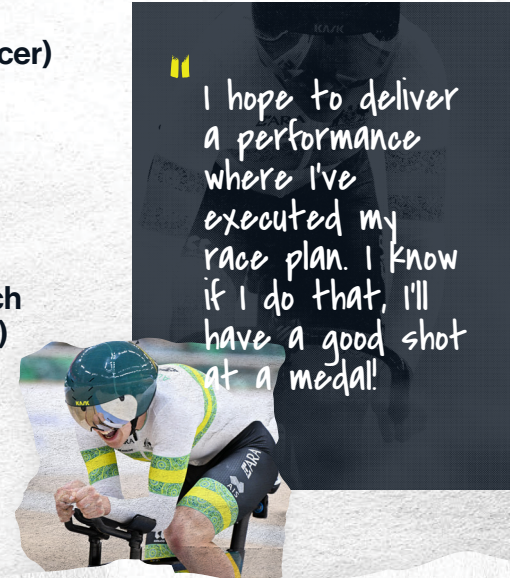

One of Australia's most successful para-cyclists, Gordon Allan has been delivering consistent results on the world stage since his international debut in 2018.

Allan has built an outstanding record across multiple UCI Para Cycling Track World Championships:

- Multiple silver and bronze medals – C2 1km time trial

Allan reached a major career milestone at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games:

- Bronze medal – Mixed C1-5 team sprint

In 2025, Allan achieved his first world title and added to his medal haul:

- Gold medal – Mixed team sprint at the UCI Para Cycling Track World Championships
- Silver medal – C2 sprint
- Bronze medal – C2 1km time trial
