Critical Considerations:

- Most track events have multiple races. The minimum number of Commissaires should be based on the race which requires the most Commissaires.
- If a large outdoor track (above 250m) or if a multi-session event additional Commissaires will be required.
- Very small State/Territory level events may be conducted with fewer Commissaires upon approval by AusCycling.
- Roles can vary throughout an event however the PCP generally remains the same.

*This may be electronic or manual recording of results (this is not a Commissaire role). This role is also responsible for generating start lists and rounds of the event. If the event organiser doesn't have personnel for this role then an additional Commissaire is required dedicated to this task.

**Three 3 timekeepers are required for any National or State/Territory record attempt, or for an in-competition record to be ratified. The PCP cannot act as Race Director under any circumstances. Under no circumstances can a Commissaire race in the same event as they are appointed in a Commissaire role.
